## INT'L ATHLETES EYEING 2017 TAGAMAN TRIATHLON

**Saipan, Northern Mariana Islands** (**NMI**) – The 2017 Tagaman 51.50 Triathlon slated for June 24, 2017, on the island of Saipan in The Marianas is being eyed by a number of international competitors. So far, event organizers have received registration or inquiries from 20 triathletes from Korea, six from Taiwan, five from Hong Kong, three from Guam, two from the Philippines, and one from USA. Pro-athletes already confirmed to return are Kaon Cho of Korea and Meiko Carey of Guam.

The early bird deadline is May 29, and athletes are encouraged to register at saipantriathlon.com. The early bird registration is \$125/Solo and \$270/Team. Also, NMI residents who participate in the pre-event Tagaman Races series and show valid proof of residency qualify for a discounted rate of \$55/Solo before the early bird deadline. Upcoming Tagaman Race series events to prepare for the main event and qualify for the discount include the 1.5 Ocean Swim on May 27 and the 50K bike race on May 28.

The Tagaman Triathlon is an annual signature event of the Marianas Visitors Authority (MVA), aimed at attracting visiting athletes and media coverage for The Marianas. Organization

of this year's event has been contracted to Northern Marianas Cycling Federation, in cooperation with Triathlon Association of the CNMI (TRAC).

"The MVA is strongly promoting the Tagaman in our source markets, and we're excited to again be working with the cycling federation and TRAC in putting together a great race for visiting and local athletes, alike," said MVA Managing Director Christopher A. Concepcion. "The partnership we have forged has proven very successful in previous events such as the Hell of the Marianas, and we know their athletic expertise is essential for making our sporting events safe, enjoyable, and memorable for the athletes."

Registration after May 29 will be \$150/Solo and \$290/Team. Registration after June 16 is \$180/Solo and \$300/Team. The last day to register is June 20.

This year's starting point and 1.5K swim leg will be Kanoa Resort Saipan, the official hotel of the event. Bikers will transition at Mina'chom Atdao Pavilion in Susupe and make the 40K bike course to Banzai and back. The 10K run will turn around at the Carolinian Utt in Garapan.

"This is going to be the fastest and most competitive Tagaman ever with the presence of elites coming from triathlon powerhouse in the region," said TRAC President Ricky Castro.

Cash prizes await the Top 3 finishers in the women's and men's open categories: \$1,000 for 1<sup>st</sup> place, \$700 for 2<sup>nd</sup> place, and \$500 for 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Awards for the Age Group Division will be awarded respectively. There will also be a relay with awards only.

The Marianas are a chain of idyllic islands including Saipan, Tinian, and Rota in the Western Pacific,

From China, direct flight service from Shanghai, Beijing, Guangzhou, and Hong Kong to Saipan are available. Philippine Airlines provides nonstop service from Manila and connects with many cities in China and Southeast Asia. United Airlines has daily flight connections from six cities in Japan to Saipan with one stop. United States mainland connections can be made to Saipan via Tokyo-Narita, Seoul-Incheon or Guam. Visitors from Russia and Taiwan usually arrive via Seoul, Tokyo or Manila. Interisland travel is provided by United Express (Cape Air) and Star Marianas Air.
