1a) **Greetings**: Understanding a culture often begins with its greetings. For instance, in Chuuk, the primary greeting is "Rananim." This word carries deeper meanings and cultural nuances beyond the simple acknowledgment of "hello." Sharing the cultural context can enhance understanding of its significance.

Example:

- Pohnpei: Kasalelie.. Kasale "beautiful"
- ❖ Yap: Mogethin.. "Say something" / opens up the conversation
- RMI: Yokwe.. Rainbow
- Guam/NMI: Håfa Ådai.."How are you caring for yourself"

- Pandanus soup (RMI)
