COVID-19 Update



Eight (8) additional individuals have been confirmed positive for COVID-19.

- The individuals were identified by travel screening and confirmed diagnosis through **testing upon arrival**.
- The individuals have been safely in quarantine and were moved to the designated isolation area for close monitoring.
- The CHCC has already initiated contact tracing for the most immediate contacts of the new confirmed cases, including passengers on the same flight.



17th ANNUAL TINIAN HOT PEPPER FESTIVAL ON FEB. 13-14, 2021

A full weekend of games and competitions are set for the 17th Tinian Hot Pepper Festival on Feb. 13-14, 2021, in The Marianas.

The festival, affectionately known as “Pika Fest” among locals (“pika” means spicy), pays homage to Tinian’s small but famous “donne sali” hot pepper. Activities will include food sales, live entertainment, competitions, arts and crafts sales, and more.

“The Marianas Visitors Authority (MVA) and the Tinian Mayor’s Office, in consultation with the CNMI COVID-19 Task Force and the Commonwealth Healthcare Corp., is pleased to announce that this year’s Tinian Hot Pepper Festival will again be held on Presidents Day weekend, with consideration of COVID-19 prevention protocols, such as social distancing, wearing of masks, and hand washing. The Marianas hasn’t had any community spread in five months, and we will have several safety measures in place to help maintain that trend,” said MVA Managing Director Priscilla M. Iakopo. “The festival will provide a good opportunity to support the Tinian businesses and provide a positive boost to the community.”

The festival will be held from the afternoon into the evening on both days, with exact times to be announced. Competitions will include hot pepper eating, “kadun pika” (spicy stew) cooking, cha-cha, tug-of-war, “umang” (hermit crab) race, and a home-made canoe race. The 18th Tinian Municipal Council will co-sponsor prizes for the male and female categories of the hot pepper eating contest.

The Tinian Hot Pepper Festival will be held at the Fiesta Grounds in San Jose, Tinian, adjacent to The Tinian Hot Pepper Festival will be held at the Fiesta Grounds in San Jose, Tinian, adjacent to Jones Beach.

PACIFIC MINI GAMES IN JUNE 2022 IN THE MARIANAS



The quadrennial Pacific Mini Games will be held in June 2022 in the Northern Marianas with 24 countries and territories throughout the Pacific invited to participate.

The Pacific Mini Games 2022 is a multi-sport event governed by the Pacific Games Council as a scaled-down version of the Pacific Games, held every alternating four years. At this time, an estimated 400-600 athletes are anticipated to participate in six events at the games: athletics, badminton, baseball, golf, beach volleyball, and triathlon. The games are expected to cost an estimated \$3.2 million to host with the six confirmed events. The Pacific Games Council has provided an initial \$20,000 in seed money, and fundraising for cash and in-kind support will also be conducted.

The organizing committee also unveiled the winning logo of the Pacific Mini Games 2022 designed by Kadi Marshal Yamada Camacho. The logo incorporates a latte stone monolith and “mwaar” (floral head lei) representing the indigenous Chamorro and Carolinian people of the Northern Marianas. Eleven flowers symbolize the 11th Pacific Mini Games, and three multi-colored individuals form a smiling face and represent the diversity and unity of the event. One individual reaching upward “for excellence” is outlined with an outrigger canoe shape, a call to voyaging and the Pacific maritime heritage. Fourteen white spaces symbolize the 14 islands of the Northern Marianas, while a purple wave sits at the base of the logo.

Also represented on the organizing committee are the CNMI Office of the Governor, Saipan Mayor’s Office, Dept. of Public Works, Dept. of Public Safety, Public School System, Hotel Association of the Northern Mariana Islands, Dept. of Community and Cultural Affairs, Dept. of Finance, Dept. of Fire & Emergency Medical Services, Commonwealth Health Care Corp. and COVID-19 Task Force, Marianas Visitors Authority, and representatives for Sports and Corporate Sponsorship.

JAPAN MARKET UPDATE



In preparation for the resumption of tourism from the source market of Japan tentatively in July or August 2021, the MVA representative office in Tokyo was reopened on Feb. 1. The office had been closed for 90 days.

Our office will work on public relations marketing activities including: 1) updating the Japanese language MVA website with COVID-19 related information on The Marianas, creating new listings for social media (Facebook Twitter, Instagram), coordinating coverage with consumer mail magazine, reaching out to media partners, issuing press releases, and conducting a Zoom seminar for consumers. In addition, travel trade marketing activities will also be conducted to include: 1) reestablishing relationships with trade partners due to organizational and personnel changes over the last several months, issue newsletters, posting information on free travel/consumer travel sites, and developing a The Marianas-Japan travel bubble based on various condition scenarios related to quarantine in The Marianas, quarantine upon return to Japan, and Japan's Travel Advice and Warning Level.

HEALTH MEASURES SET FOR TINIAN HOT PEPPER FESTIVAL

COVID-19 safety protocols and other mitigation measures have been set for the 17th Tinian Hot Pepper Festival on Feb. 13-14, 2021, in The Marianas. Despite five months of no community transmission of COVID-19 in The Marianas, the Marianas Visitors Authority (MVA) will implement a series of measures recommended by the Commonwealth Healthcare Corp. and COVID-19 Task Force at the festival. The Dept. of Public Safety will manage the entry of and take the temperature of all attendees at the festival site. Handwashing stations will be installed around the event area, and attendees are required to wear face masks. Clear shields will be installed at all booths to prevent direct contact between vendors and customers.

This year's event will also include the Pika 50K Bike Race, funded by the Tinian Mayor's Office, with cash prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in several categories. Bikers may contact Dawn Sarmiento at 1.670287.3667 to register.

EXTRA FLIGHTS, FERRY FOR TINIAN HOT PEPPER FEST

Star Marianas Air, in cooperation with the Marianas Visitors Authority (MVA) and Tinian Mayor's Office, will extend its normal hours of operation during the 17th Annual Tinian Hot Pepper Festival on Feb. 13-14, 2021. In addition, limited ferry service will also be available.

On Feb. 12-14, Star Marianas scheduled flights will be extended by four hours, with the last flights leaving Tinian at 9:30 p.m. Flights will leave Saipan hourly at the top of the hour (starting at 8 a.m.) and leave Tinian at the bottom of the hour (starting at 8:30 a.m.).

The ferry is available on Feb. 13 and Feb. 14, departing Saipan at 10 a.m. and departing Tinian at 8 p.m. on both days. The Super Emerald ferry will depart from the Commonwealth Ports Authority dock in Lower Base, Saipan. Passengers must check in one hour before departure. Departure time is prompt but may change based on ocean conditions. Ferry round trip cost is \$40 for ages 3 and older. For one way, the cost is \$20 for ages 3 and older. The ferry is free for children ages 0-2. Advance ticket purchase is required and will be accommodated on a first come, first served basis. Ticket purchases may be made at the MVA Office in Saipan. Cash payments only will be accepted. Due to capacity restrictions, Pika 50K Bike Race participants only with proof of registration will have a reserved ferry to Tinian on Feb. 12.

The festival will be held from 4-11 p.m. on both days. The Pika 50K Bike Race at 6:30 a.m. on Feb. 13, funded by the Tinian Mayor's Office, with cash prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in several categories.
