The 1st Tri-annual Meeting of the Pacific Asia Travel Association (PATA) Micronesia Chapter was held on Apr. 2-4, 2019, in the Republic of the Marshall Islands, marking the beginning of the chapter's 33rd year. Dozens of members representing national and state tourism offices of Micronesia, representatives of travel trade and other businesses, elected officials, and private individuals attended the meeting, held in Majuro atoll and Eneko Island.

Committee meetings were held at Marshall Islands Resort in Majuro atoll on the first day of meeting. Education Committee Chairwoman Denise Mendiola reported on training conducted throughout the region in 2018, including Hospitality Industry Customer Service and CPR, First Aid and AED training. The chapter is accepting training requests for 2019, which will be held in partnership with the Small Business Development Center, United Airlines, and respective island territory tourism offices and other partners. Marketing Committee Chairwoman Laurie DeBrum reported on upcoming events where the islands will be collectively marketed as a Micronesian region, including PATA Travel Mart, Asia Dive Expo 2019, Divers Equipment Marketing Association (DEMA) 2019, Scuba Show 2019, and others. Cultural, Heritage & Environment Chairwoman Rita Nauta emphasized the shared heritage of celestial navigation throughout the region. Membership Committee Chairwoman Lou Aguon-Schulte highlighted the convenience of the new online membership application and payment.

The PATA Micronesia general membership meeting was held on Apr. 3 on the neighboring island of Eneko, where bungalows, a cookhouse, and white sand beaches welcome visitors. Each of the national and state tourism officers reported on the status of visitor arrivals, upcoming events for tourists, upcoming marketing event, and other news.

On the final day, participants had the option to visit Mili Atoll, where some theorize famed aviator Amelia Earhart and navigator Fred Noonan may have landed in 1937. Stephanie Nakamura, PATA Micronesia Chairwoman thankedThe Ministry of Natural Resources & Commerce; the Office of Commerce, Investment, and Tourism, Bank of the Marshall Islands, Marshall Island Holdings, Inc., Marshall Islands Resort and new PATA Micronesia member Air Nauru, who hosted receptions for the attendees.

PVA's role in the program is not to drastically change what Angaur already has to offer, but to add value to where it is marketable and exciting for travelers (and residents), and most significantly, where it can improve community welfare.

Angaur Governor Mr. Kennouski Suzuky and his team showed the PVA team around the island to look for potential sites to initiate development.

The monkey sanctuary site and camping sites aim to attract tourists and slowly gain momentum for more positive initiatives.



Palau Visitors Authority Formally Starts Alii Pass program with Nachesar State

On Apr. 26, 2019, the Palau Visitors Authority (PVA) signed a Memorandum of Understand ing Ngchesar State Covernment to formally start the Alii Pass Program between PVA and Ngchesar State.

Alii Pass program, formerly known as the One Stop Shop program, aims to enhance the state's attractions such as the Mesekelat Reserve and waterfalls by incorporating eco-friendly activities such as camping, hiking, and mountain biking trails, improving the trails with signage for various plants, trees, and markers within the trails.

The path fo the waterfalls with be improved to allow more accessibility of the senere nature that is found in the waterfalls. With these enhancements and more, the objective is to drive tourism to Ngchesar State, to create a venue where the state government and community members directly benefit from tourism. Ngchesar State is the third state to official sign on to the Alii Pass program, the first two states were Airai State and Ngarchelong State, respectively.

Palau Sweeps Awards at Japan Marine Diving Fair

Once again, Palau topped the awards list at the Marine Diving Fair (MDF) in Tokyo, Japan. The MDF 2019 in Tokyo, Japan, was held from Apr. 5-7, 2019, and the awarding ceremony was on Apr. 5.

For eight consecutive years, Palau once again was recognized and received 1st place for Best Dive Area, followed by the Philippines and Maldives. Palau Pacific Resort was ranked 1st place for Best Hotel for Divers. For Best Liveaboards, Palau Sport won 2nd place and Ryoma Palau took 4th place. For Favorite Diving Operators, Palau took 3rd, 4th, and 5th place with DayDream, Aqua Magic Palau, and Blue Marlin. Participants of MDF were IMPAC Tour, Belau Tour, Palau Sport, DayDream, Cove Resort Palau, Palasia Hotel Palau, Dolphins Pacific, CoCo Divers, and the Palau Visitors Authority Board of Directors Ms. Yumie Morishita and Mr. Olkeriil Kazuo.

Based on PVA Japan representative Mr. Tsuyoshi Shibamura's observation during MDF 2019, Palau is becoming more popular for Japanese divers and Palau has gained a certain position and continues to maintain its standing in the Japanese Diving Market.

Yap Newest Addition to WWII Tours of Micronesia

For more than 10 years, the Yap Visitors Bureau has been working closely with Patrick Ranfranz, founder of the Missing Crew Project, and villages throughout Yap to conserve important sites that are associated with World War II. Yap's mainland and its neighboring islands were a strategic location during the final year of the war where daily air battles took place between the United States and Japan. As a result, the planes that were downed and the artillery equipment, cave, and even foxholes that remained when the war ended were left to rust and be consumed by the forest and surrounding ocean.

Thanks to Ranfranz, 23 of those sites have been cleared and preserved with informative signs installed that tell visitors to the island about the men who fought during thosd last months between 1944 and 1945, as well as the impact of the Japanese presence that had been in Yap for more than 30 years by then.

The memorials, considered among the best in the Pacific region, have caught the attention of Calirfornia-based Valor Tours that often offers group tours to WWII sites around the world. In late March, Valor Tour guide Anderson Giles arrived in Yap to begin preparing to accompany the first group that will visit Yap in 2020. Accompanying him were active duty military men and women from the U.S. Third Fleet, I Marine Expeditionary Force and Navy Expeditionary Combat Command.

21st Annual Taste of The Marianas International Food Festival & Beer Garden Held in May

The 21st Annual Taste of The Marianas International Food Festival & Beer Garden was held in May 2019 in Saipan. The festival is an annual signature event of the Marianas Visitors Authority (MVA) and is one of the largest annual celebrations in The Marianas. The festival featured international cuisine at affordable prices from 23 local hotels, restaurant, and drink vendors, along with non-stop live entertainment on the main stage and weekly competitions. Cash sales by the MVA were 8 percent higher than last year and 23 per cent higher than 2017. The first three weeks broke all records will more than \$50,000 in nightly sales.

On the final night, Chef Richard Meimban of Grandvrio Resort Saipan bested five other competitors in the Hotel Association of the Northern Mariana Islands' (HANMI) Junior Chefs Competition. This year's theme, "Chinese Style Beef," was a nod to the exponential grow in arrivals to The Marianas from China in recent years. The competition is also sponsored by Triple J Five Star Wholesale Foods, and contestants were required to use Certified Angus Beef® sirloin flap and at least three local ingredients from Garapan Public Market. Earlier competitions in the month included the Kadun Pika Cook-off, BBQ Whole Chicken Cook-off, and J's Fried Rice Eating Competition, featuring the triumphant return of professional food fighter Sachiyo Masubuchi of Japan, who won the 2018 J's Fried Rice Eating Competition. The MVA rolled out special incentives to increase sales this year. Each Saturday, the first 40 patrons to purchase \$40 or more in Taste tokens received a free caricature sketch by Ronald Valiente. Also, those who purchase at least \$20 worth of tokens on the last two Saturdays received a raffle ticket for giveaways throughout the evening. YVB is looking forward to having not just visitors to Yap and residents but also local school children visit the new addition to the museum to learn about Yap's culture and heritage. Until then, the collection has been loaned to the FSM Consul General's Office on Guam where it will be on display until the completion of the new building later this year.
