Human Resource Capacity Development Project

Yap Visitors Bureau is participating in a Human Resource Capacity Development project that recognizes the importance of traditional building skills as an important sector in supporting Yap's tourism industry. A hands-on practical traditional skills training experience is planned utilizing the Yap Living History Museum as a venue. The museum has traditional building in need of restoration. The traditional skills experience will involve the preparation of traditional building materials, including large and small bamboo, betel nut trunks, breadfruit logs, pandanus logs, mahogany logs, Nipa leaves, and banana fiber preparation. These prepared materials will be used to completely replace the roof of the men's house, and repair the remaining roofs, floors, and walls, of the other traditional buildings on the museum grounds.

Identification Signs Yap Living History Museum

Yap Living History Museum has finally received the identification signs for the different traditional buildings at the museum sight. The signs will be placed accordingly before the end of this year.





Yap Living History Museum –Information Booklet

Yap Visitors Bureau has produced a beta copy of the Yap Living History museum guide. The guide describes the building and purpose of the traditional Yapese structures located on the museum grounds. The design and construction of these buildings is complex and based on traditions that are centuries old. The guide also reviews how the local materials are processed and utilized in each of the structures. The guide also has information on local plants and trees that are located on the grounds. Plant identification signs will soon be installed on the grounds with a reference

Beach Gardenia

Guettarda speciosa Rubiaceae (Madder Family)



Description: Local name – Blaw (Y).

A woody plant, *Blaw* may reach heights of 15 m (50 ft) or more and has large oblong leaves, 12-30 cm (5-12 in) in length. Its flowers are white, tubular, and attractively scented, and its brown fruit are about 2-3 cm (1 in) long. It is sometimes used as an ornamental and/or as a windbreak. Its strong trunk can be used for house timber and strong paddles, and the branches make for excellent firewood. The bark and flowers can be used medicinally, and the sweet-smelling flowers are used for garlands (*nunuw*).

Betel Leaf-Piper betle

Description: Local name – Gabuuy (Y).

A high-climbing vine with oval or heartshaped leaves, 7-10 cm (3-4 in.) long and unequally rounded at the base, with 5-9 prominent veins. The male and female flowers are produced in narrow spikes on separate plants. All parts of this vine are used for medicine, and to chew the traditional betel nut quid (langad).
